International Youth Exchange in Indigenous Health

Indigenous Student Services, McMaster University and the <u>Poche Centre for Indigenous Health</u> at the <u>University of Sydney</u> in Australia have developed an 8-week exchange for 2 Indigenous youth from each organization. This exchange will provide Indigenous youth the opportunity to work with Indigenous researchers who are engaged in health research and practice in communities.

The Poche Centre for Indigenous Health aims to: provide specialist health services for Aboriginal people; build and support education and career pathways for Aboriginal people; develop opportunities for students and graduates to participate in Aboriginal health service delivery, and develop and sustain collaborative evidence to practice research.

This youth exchange is a pilot program funded by McMaster Indigenous Student Services, the McMaster Indigenous Research Institute (MIRI), the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health at the University of Sydney, Australia with support from International Experience Canada, McMaster Student Success Centre, the McMaster Indigenous Student Health Sciences Office and the Indigenous Studies Program.

The 2020 exchange will occur between May 1 and July 3, 2020.

1. Eligibility

Indigenous (First Nations, Métis and Inuit) students from McMaster currently registered in:

- graduate program OR
- Level III or Level IV of an undergraduate program

Students must be planning to return to McMaster in September 2020.

Eligible applicants must be between the ages of 18-35 years old.

2. Support

Two students will each receive a stipend of \$5,000. The stipend is intended to support the student financially while they work in Australia as a Research Assistant over the course of eight weeks. Ten percent of the stipend will be paid upon completion of the exchange and completing a written reflection (see "Requirements" section).

Other support available to students selected:

- Housing in Sydney will be arranged and paid by the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health
- Advice and information on preparing for international travel
- Advice and information on budgeting, fundraising
- Training and other learning opportunities while in Australia



3. Work Term

Two students will be selected and will work as Research Assistants on one of two current projects at the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health:

- iECG screening to detect Atrial Fibrillation in Aboriginal adults
- <u>Aboriginal Precision Medicine Project</u>; establishing a base genome for Gamilaraay/Kamilaroi people in NSW

4. Requirements

- Students will be required to pay their own travel to and from Sydney, Australia, including applicable fees for travel VISA.
- Students will work 20 hours per week as a Research Assistant for the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health. The Poche Centre will provide a job description prior to beginning the work exchange.
- Students should maintain regular communication with their supervisor (or designate) regarding research progress, milestones, challenges, etc.
- Students will write a 500 word reflection to be included in a report prepared by McMaster Indigenous Student Services. The reflections and report will be used to evaluate this pilot program.
